In answer to a question by **Councilmember McClellan, City Manager Williford** stated that he was informed that the City of El Cajon would be sued if the citizens voted no on Measure S. As with other legal issues, Staff would seek the advice from **City Council** on how to proceed at that point.

City Attorney Foley added that should Measure S be turned down, the courts could alter the City's Charter to enforce the districts forming. This would be done at a costly price to the City.
