**BACKGROUND:** On August 9, 2016, a public hearing was held to consider placing on the November 8, 2016 ballot, a measure amending Section 201 of the El Cajon Charter to establish districts for future elections of Councilmembers in the City of El Cajon. The City Council approved the proposal, and Resolutions were adopted ordering submission of the measure on the November 8, 2016 ballot.

The Registrar of Voters has declared the results of that election and the Amendment to El Cajon Charter Section 201, Measure S, passed by a majority vote as follows:

18,671 - Yes 8,327 - No

Complete Election results are attached to this report. Measure S results can be found on Page 20. Upon adoption of the Resolution declaring the results, and pursuant to Government Code Section 34460, certified copies of the charter amendment text, and required documentation, will be recorded with the San Diego County Recorder, sent to the Secretary of State, and filed with the archives for the City of El Cajon. The amended Charter will be in effect after it has been accepted and chaptered by the Secretary of State and an acknowledgement received.

FISCAL IMPACT: A total budget of \$110,000.00 was allocated for the November 2016 Election for the costs to elect three Council members and for the ballot measure (Measure S). Final costs are not expected to be determined by Registrar of Voters office until early in 2017.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016 TO CONSIDER AN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 201 OF THE EI CAJON CITY CHARTER; DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF. AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a regular general municipal election was held and conducted in the City of El Cajon, California, on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in the time, form and manner provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed, and that in all respects said election was held and conducted, and the votes were cast, received and canvassed, and the returns made and declared in the time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California relating to general law cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 074-16, adopted on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2016, the County Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of said election, and has certified the results to the City Clerk of the City of El Cajon, said results are received, attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL HEREBY DECLARES THE RESULTS OF SAID ELECTION AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That there were 62 voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election consisting of consolidations of the election precincts in said City as established for the holding of state and county elections.

SECTION 2: The total number of votes cast in the precincts, except absentee voter ballots, and provisional ballots, was 9,802. The total number of absentee voter ballots cast in the City was 17,196. The total number of votes cast in the City in the Municipal Election, including votes cast in the precincts and absentee voter ballots was 26,998.

SECTION 3: That the Municipal Election was held for the purpose of electing three (3) members of the City Council for terms expiring in December 2020 and submitting to the voters of said City the following measure (Measure S):

**MEASURE S**: Do you approve amending Section 201 of the City of El Cajon Charter to require election of City Council members by geographic districts in which they reside beginning with the general municipal election to be held in 2018?

That the total number of votes received for Measure S are as follows:

Measure S – City of El Cajon Charter City Measure Yes 18,671 No 8,327

SECTION 4: That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City for and against said measure, are attached as Exhibit "A."

SECTION 5: That the complete text of the amended Section 201 of the El Cajon City Charter is hereby set forth in Exhibit "B."

SECTION 6: The City Council does declare and determine that:

That as a result of said election, a more than one-half majority of the voters voting on the measure relating to MEASURE S did vote in favor of it, and that the measure was carried, and shall be deemed adopted and is hereby ratified by the City Council.

SECTION 7: The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of said City a statement to the result of said election showing:

- (a) The whole number of votes cast in the City;
- (b) The measure voted upon;
- (c) The number of votes given at each precinct for and against the measure; and
- (d) The total number of votes for and against the measure.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016; DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF, AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a regular general municipal election was held and conducted in the City of El Cajon, California, on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in the time, form and manner provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed, and that in all respects said election was held and conducted, and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed, and the returns made and declared in the time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 047-16, adopted on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2016, the County Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of said election, and has certified the results to this City Council. Said results are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That there were 62 voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election consisting of consolidations of the regular election precincts in said City as established for the holding of state and county elections.

W.E. "Bob" McClellan, Ben Kalasho, and Steve Goble were elected as Members of the City Council of the City of El Cajon for a full term of four years.

SECTION 7: The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of said City a statement to the result of said election showing:

- (a) The whole number of votes cast in the City;
- (b) The names of the persons voted for;
- (c) The measure voted upon; and
- (d) For what office each person was voted for.

SECTION 8: That the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of such persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the City Clerk and duly authenticated; that the City Clerk, or any person designated by the City Clerk, shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California, and shall have them subscribe thereto and file the same in the office of the City Clerk. Whereupon, each and all of said persons so elected shall be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected.

SECTION 9: The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; shall enter the same in the book of original Resolutions of said City; and shall make a minute of passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council of said City, in the minutes of the meeting at which the same is passed and adopted.

City Manager Williford indicated that he would meet with the City Attorney and Police Chief on this matter. He will keep the speaker informed on the status and inform Council on the options.

Councilmember Kendrick requested that Staff report to Council within 30 days, and suggested that Council may want to consider an ordinance addressing this type of issue.

**Richard Graydon** spoke about the East County Performing Arts Center, which has not yet been finished. He commented on the 700 homeless people in the City asking for money and food. She stated that a double billing has occurred, which has created a financial hardship for her family. She is making payments on the balance, and does not feel a lien is warranted at this time.

**Philip** expressed concerns about the dangers of growing the plants indoors. Chemicals are used, and kids may be exposed to them. He stated that outdoor growing is safer.

**Kovu** stated the plants are meant to be grown outdoors and that the City should make some requirements for outdoor growing. As the people voted for the measure, trying to place restrictions is not conducive to morale. He indicated it would be more expensive to grow indoors.



**RECOMMENDATION:** That the City Council authorizes the Purchasing Agent to waive the bidding requirements in accordance with Municipal Code 3.20.010.C.1A, and execute a purchase agreement with Dooley Enterprises, Inc. for the purchase of factory loaded ammunition in the amount of \$86,418.08.

BACKGROUND: The Chief of Police has submitted the attached memorandum dated October 21, 2016, with sole source justification to purchase the specified ammunition from Dooley Enterprises, Inc. due to bullet performance, configuration performance, reputation, and availability.

The sole source request from the Chief of Police has been reviewed and Purchasing has confirmed that Dooley Enterprises, Inc. is the exclusive Winchester Law Enforcement Distributor for Southern California.

As a result, this purchase is recommended as an exception to the City's competitive bidding requirement pursuant to Municipal Code 3.20.010.C.1A, finding that: "The bidding procedures of this chapter may be waived, and an open market purchase pursuant to Section 3.20.110 of this chapter may be authorized when the commodity or service can be obtained from only one source." Purchasing, in concurrence with the Chief of Police, recommends this purchase be made from Doolev Enterprises, Inc., as being in the best interest of the City.

FISCAL IMPACT: Sufficient funds are available for this purchase in Activity/Account #130120-8160 (Police-Inspection, Training, and Personnel) and #130230-8160 (Police-Ancillary and Auxiliary Units.)

SUBJECT: Duty Ammunition Sole Source Request – Req #299692

In conjunction with Requisition #299692, the police department would like to request procurement of Winchester ammunition in FY2016-17 be sole sourced to Dooley Enterprises.

The police department has a dedicated Range Master/Armorer who is responsible for continuously reviewing and specifying ammunition for use by department personnel while on duty. There are several critical factors used in determining department authorized and provided ammunition, including how the ammunition functions in the weapon, bullet performance, (e.g. muzzle velocity, energy, etc.,) how the weapon modifications, (such as armoring and other accessories,) effect bullet performance, and any recalls or issues that are reported concerning ammunition that might affect the department. The Armorer reviews published ballistic tables of various types of ammunition, which are made available to law enforcement agencies. This bullet performance data is then considered in conjunction with testing and evaluation with the firearms that are in department approved configurations, to ensure the ammunition performs at the level required of a law enforcement agency where there is no margin for error.

Although there are many companies that sell ammunition, the police department elects to consider five (5) sources that have a long-standing reputation as providers of reliable ammunition (in function, testing procedures and result reporting). Utilizing ammunition from a reputable company reduces liability for the department and increases safety for officers by minimizing the likelihood of misfires and other ammunition failures. The five companies currently considered are Winchester, Federal, Remington, Black Hills and Hornady.


Based on reviewing the ballistics performance of the five manufacturers, it was determined

by the department's range master, Winchester ammunition will provide the best and most reliable performance based on the department's configuration of its weapons. (The range master has specified Hornady ammo for some SWAT weapons.) In addition to the ballistics data and testing and evaluation that is done for determination of department-approved ammunition, availability is also a critical factor. Four years ago the department began experiencing significant delays in receiving ammunition that was ordered due to a surge in demand for ammo by the general population. The constricted ammunition market continues, lead times are estimated at 3-6 months. (Experience has shown there are often delays beyond what is initially promised). In order to ensure the police department has timely access to required ammunition for training and duty use, it is critical that the selected supplier be able to supply the annual order within three months of order placement, and maintain an adequate inventory supply on hand for immediate purchase if necessary.

The only ammunition and vendor that satisfies all of these ballistic performance, configuration performance, reputation and availability criteria is Winchester which is sole sourced through Dooley Enterprises, (see attached sole source letter from Dooley). Based on the totality of factors considered and laid out above, the police department requests that the ammunition ordered in Req #299692 be purchased on a sole source basis from Dooley Enterprises.

BACKGROUND: On February 23, 2016, the contract for Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) Channel Repairs was awarded by City Council Resolution No. 020-16 to New Century Construction, Inc. The project consisted of repair and replacement of cracked concrete, concrete joint repairs, and damaged concrete sections at various locations along the County Ditch, Washington, and Forrester Creek channels. This project is part of a cyclical maintenance effort to provide needed repairs to the City's main storm drain channels. All contract work was completed on October 26, 2016. Quantities and payments have been finalized, and there are no pending claims.

FISCAL IMPACT: The majority of the City's concrete channels were constructed in the 1970's and are coming to the end of their life cycle. Repairs made with this contract will extend the useful life of the channels and will reduce the long-term maintenance efforts. The total construction expenditure for this contract is \$246,908.00. The project was funded with Wastewater Funds from account #650900-9065/WW3518.







## RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council:

- 1) Finds the third, fourth, and sixth low bidders non-responsive for the reasons set forth in this agenda report; and
- 2) Adopts the next RESOLUTION in order awarding the bid to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, S.C. Valley Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$731,154.00 for the base bid and Additive Alternate: Furnish and Install Traffic Signal Ethernet Cable and Wireless Radio.

BACKGROUND: On September 13, 2016, the City Council approved the bid plans and specifications for the Upgrade Traffic Signals – Fletcher Parkway/Broadway project. The project involves the installation of fiber-optic communications between twenty-five existing traffic signals and the City's Traffic Management Center. The scope of work includes the conversion of 9.8 miles of outdated copper wire traffic signal interconnect cable with twelve strand, single-mode fiber optic cable, as well as, new traffic controllers, communication equipment, and thirty video detection cameras along the Fletcher Parkway/Broadway corridor between Navajo Road and East Main Street. Forty prospective bidders obtained bid packages and seven responses were received and opened at 2:00 p.m. on October 25, 2016.

This project is funded by the California Department of Transportation's Highway Safety Improvement Program and requires a signed "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities" form in order to receive grant funding. The third low bidder did not sign the "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities" form and has been deemed non-responsive.

In addition, as cited in the bid specifications, a copy of the bidder's *Good Faith Effort* must be submitted to provide proof the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goal has been met to receive grant funding. City staff provided an additional four days after the bid opening date for all bidders to submit this documentation. However, the City did not receive responses from the fourth and sixth low bidders, thereby deeming them non-responsive.

Purchasing, in concurrence with the Assistant City Manager, recommends award of the bid to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, S.C. Valley Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$731,154.00 (base bid of \$717,054.00 plus Additive Alternates of \$14,100.00). The summary of bids is attached and complete proposals are on file in Purchasing.

FISCAL IMPACT: Sufficient funds are available for this project through the Highway Safety Improvement Program Grant obtained by the Public Works Department (550000/PW3516).



- 2. Appropriates the State Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant funds in the amount of \$326,098; and
- 3. Authorizes the City Manager or designee to accept FY 2016 State Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant funded equipment purchased on behalf of the City of El Cajon.

#### BACKGROUND:

Since September 11, 2001, there has been a heightened concern over the potential for an act of terrorism to occur again within the borders of the United States. The Federal Government, through the Department of Homeland Security, has provided communities throughout the Country with hundreds of millions of dollars for the fight against terrorism.

The FY 2016 State Homeland Security – Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant funding will be utilized by the Fire and Police Departments for the following items:

- 1. A partial replacement of dispatch consoles, enabling the Police Communication Center to connect to the federally mandated P25 compliant next generation RCS radio system (\$310,000).
- 2. Reimbursement for selected UASI-sponsored training and exercises (\$16,098).

Additionally, the Police Department will be receiving night vision goggles, which will be purchased regionally and transferred to the City of El Cajon for the El Cajon Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

This grant will provide \$326,098 to the Special Revenue Fund and will not impact the General Fund. No matching funds are required for this grant. These funds will be used by the Police and Fire Departments for the projects listed above or as indicated by modifications to the grant.

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the El Cajon Housing Authority review and accept the Annual Report of the El Cajon Housing Authority (Housing Authority), substantially in the form as presented, for fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

BACKGROUND: In 1971, the City Council of the City of El Cajon established the El Cajon Redevelopment Agency to oversee redevelopment activities in the City. Tax increment financing was the primary source of funding used to carry out redevelopment activities, and numerous projects (both housing and non-housing) were completed since that time. However, in 2011, the California Supreme Court upheld ABx1 26 effectively eliminating redevelopment agencies throughout the State. Prior to the effective date of the dissolution, and in order to preserve the ability to continue to be responsible for the housing and non-housing assets of the former Redevelopment Agency, the City Council designated the City of El Cajon as the Successor Agency for non-housing assets and commitments in progress, and also established and activated the El Cajon Housing Authority as the successor agency for all housing assets of the former Redevelopment Agency.

This Housing Successor Annual Report (Report) regarding the Low and Moderate Income Housing Asset Fund (LMIHAF) has been prepared pursuant to California Health and Safety Code (HSC) section 34176.1 (f) and is dated as of December 13, 2016. This Report sets forth certain details of the Housing Authority of the City of El Cajon (Housing Successor) activities during Fiscal Year 2015-16. The purpose of this Report is to provide the governing body of the Housing Successor an annual report on the housing assets and activities of the Housing Successor under Part 1.85, Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code, in particular sections 34176 and 34176.1 (Dissolution Law).

The Report is based upon information prepared by Housing Successor staff and information contained within the independent financial audit of the Low and Moderate Income Housing Asset Fund for Fiscal Year 2015-16 which was conducted by Rogers, Anderson, Malody and Scott, LLP as required. This Report must be provided to the Housing Successor's governing body by December 31, 2016 (six months after the end of the Fiscal Year). In addition, this Report and the former redevelopment agency's pre-dissolution Implementation Plan are to be made available to the public on the City's website.

This Report details the activities of the El Cajon Housing Authority (Housing Authority) during Fiscal Year 2015/16. The purpose of this Report is to provide the governing body of the Housing Authority information on the housing assets and activities of the Housing Authority under Part 1.85, Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code (HSC), in particular sections 34176 and 34176.1 (Dissolution Law).

The following is based upon information prepared by the Housing Authority staff and data from the independent financial audit of the Housing Authority Special Revenue Fund contained in the City of El Cajon Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for Fiscal Year 2015/16 as prepared by Rogers, Anderson, Malody & Scott, LLP. Furthermore, this Report conforms with and is organized into sections I. through XI., inclusive, pursuant to HSC Section 34176.1(f) of the Dissolution Law:

- I. Amount Deposited into LMIHAF: This section provides the total amount of funds deposited into the LMIHAF during the Fiscal Year. Any amounts deposited for items listed on the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) must be distinguished from the other amounts deposited.
- II. **Ending Balance of LMIHAF:** This section provides a statement of the balance in the LMIHAF as of the close of the Fiscal Year. Any amounts deposited for items listed on the ROPS must be distinguished from the other amounts deposited.
- III. **Description of Expenditures from LMIHAF:** This section provides a description of the expenditures made from the LMIHAF during the Fiscal Year. The expenditures are to be categorized.
- IV. Statutory Value of Assets Owned by El Cajon Housing Authority: This section provides the statutory value of real property owned by the El Cajon Housing Authority, the value of loans and grants receivables, and the sum of these two amounts.

- V. **Description of Transfers:** This section describes transfers, if any, to another Housing Authority agency made in previous Fiscal Year(s), including whether the funds are unencumbered and the status of projects, if any, for which the transferred LMIHAF will be used. The sole purpose of the transfers must be for the development of transit priority projects, permanent supportive housing, housing for agricultural employees or special needs housing.
- VI. **Project Descriptions:** This section describes any project for which the Housing Authority receives or holds property tax revenue pursuant to the ROPS and the status of that project.
- VII. Status of Compliance with Section 33334.16: This section provides a status update on compliance with Section 33334.16 for interests in real property acquired by the former redevelopment agency prior to February 1, 2012. For interests in real property acquired on or after February 1, 2012, a status update is provided on the project.
- VIII. **Description of Outstanding Obligations under Section 33413:** This section describes the outstanding inclusionary and replacement housing obligations, if any, under Section 33413 that remained outstanding prior to dissolution of the former redevelopment agency as of February 1, 2012 along with the Housing Authority's progress in meeting those prior obligations, if any, of the former redevelopment agency and the Housing Authority's plans to meet unmet obligations, if any.
- IX. **Income Test:** This section provides the information required by Section 34176.1(a)(3)(B), or a description of expenditures by income restriction for five year period, with the time period beginning January 1, 2014 and whether the statutory thresholds have been met. However, reporting of the Income Test is not required until 2019.
- X. **Senior Housing Test:** This section provides the percentage of units of deed-restricted rental housing restricted to seniors and assisted individually or jointly by the Housing Authority, its former redevelopment Agency, and its host jurisdiction within the previous 10 years in relation to the aggregate number of units of deed-restricted rental housing assisted individually or jointly by the El Cajon Housing Authority, its former Redevelopment Agency and its host jurisdiction within the same time period. For this Report the ten-year period reviewed is July 1, 2006 to June 30, 2016.
- XI. Excess Surplus Test: This section provides the amount of excess surplus in the LMIHAF, if any, and the length of time that the Housing Authority has had excess surplus, and the El Cajon Housing Authority's plan for eliminating the excess surplus.

This Report is to be provided to the Housing Authority's governing body by December 31, 2016. Senate Bill 341 allows for 2% of the \$14,286,067 total Housing Authority assets, or \$285,721, to be used on monitoring and administrative expenditures. The Community Development Department Housing Division continues to monitor and manage these LMIHAF assets. Program income from loan repayments totaling \$282,358 has been committed to fund new projects in the coming fiscal year.

#### IV. STATUTORY VALUE OF ASSETS OWNED BY EL CAJON HOUSING AUTHORITY IN LMIHAF

Under the Dissolution Law and for purposes of this Report, the "statutory value of real property" means the value of properties formerly held by the former redevelopment agency as listed on the housing asset transfer schedule approved by the Department of Finance as listed in such schedule under Section 34176(a)(2), the value of the properties transferred to the Housing Authority pursuant to Section 34181(f), and the purchase price of property purchased by the El Cajon Housing Authority. Further, the value of loans and grants receivable is included in these reported assets held in the LMIHAF.

The El Cajon Housing Authority does not receive or hold property tax revenue pursuant to the ROPS.

#### VII. STATUS OF COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 33334,16

With respect to interests in real property acquired by the former redevelopment agency prior to February 1, 2012, the time periods described in Section 33334.16 shall be deemed to have commenced on the date that the Department of Finance approved the property as a housing asset in the LMIHAF. Thus, for any real property acquired by the former redevelopment agency now held by the El Cajon Housing Authority in the LMIHAF, the El Cajon Housing Authority must initiate activities consistent with the development of the real property for the purpose for which it was acquired within five years of the date the DOF approved such property as a housing asset. For the El Cajon Housing Authority, the date of DOF's approval was August 23, 2012.

Section 34176.1 provides that Section 33334.16 does not apply to interests in real property acquired by the El Cajon Housing Authority on or after February 1, 2012; however, this Report presents a status update on the projects related to such real property.

#### VIII. DESCRIPTION OF OUTSTANDING OBLIGATIONS PURSUANT TO SECTION 33413

Replacement Housing (Section 33413(a)): As set forth in the 2009-14 El Cajon Redevelopment Agency Five Year Implementation Plan and Ten Year Housing Compliance Plan for the former redevelopment agency, adopted at a public hearing on June 23, 2009, the agency's replacement obligations totaled 15 units (30 bedrooms) for moderate income households. The outstanding replacement housing obligation was met with the completion of construction of the 49-unit Solterra Senior Residences development for very low income seniors in 2013. The outstanding housing production obligations were met with the completion of the following projects on or after February 1, 2012:

- Two (2) First-time Homebuyer loans for low income households in 2012 (Birchwood Lane);
- Development of the 49-unit Solterra Senior Residences in 2013 (48 units restricted for very low income and 1 unit restricted for moderate income); and
- Recording of covenants to impose a requirement that 15% of the units (13 units) in the El Cajon Senior Towers be restricted to very low income households through the sale of adjacent property at 146 Ballantyne in 2013.

#### IX. EXTREMELY-LOW INCOME TEST

Section 34176.1(a)(3)(B) requires that the El Cajon Housing Authority must require at least 30% of the LMIHAF to be expended for development of rental housing affordable to and occupied by households earning 30% or less of the AMI. If the El Cajon Housing Authority fails to comply with the Extremely-Low Income requirement in any five-year report, then the El Cajon Housing Authority must ensure that at least 50% of the funds remaining in the LMIHAF be expended in each fiscal year following the latest fiscal year following the report on households earning 30% or less of the AMI until the El Cajon Housing Authority demonstrates compliance with the Extremely-Low Income requirement. This information is not required to be reported until 2019 for the 2014 – 2019 period.

#### **X. SENIOR HOUSING TEST**

The El Cajon Housing Authority is to calculate the percentage of units of deed-restricted rental housing restricted to seniors and assisted by the El Cajon Housing Authority, the former redevelopment agency and/or the City within the previous 10 years in relation to the aggregate number of units of deed-restricted rental housing assisted by the El Cajon Housing Authority, the former redevelopment agency and/or City within the same time period. If this percentage exceeds 50%, then the El Cajon Housing Authority cannot expend future funds in the LMIHAF to assist additional senior housing units until the El Cajon Housing Authority or City assists and construction has commenced on a number of restricted rental units that is equal to 50% of the total amount of deed-restricted rental units.

SUBJECT: Extension of Urgency Ordinance Temporarily Prohibiting the Outdoor Cultivation of Marijuana Plants Grown for Personal Use

RECOMMENDATION: That the El Cajon City Council

- Opens the Public Hearing and receives testimony;
- Closes the Public Hearing; and
- By not less than a four-fifths affirmative vote, adopts an ordinance extending the previously adopted urgency ordinance to temporarily prohibit the outdoor cultivation of marijuana plants grown by persons in the city of El Cajon for personal use, while staff continues to assess the impacts of the proposition, and to recommend any changes to El Cajon Municipal Code Title 17 allowed or required by Proposition 64.

**BACKGROUND:** Ordinance No. 5054 was adopted by the City Council on November 15, 2016, as an interim urgency ordinance in order to temporarily prevent and prohibit the outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals for personal use, in all zones within the city, until such reasonable time as a detailed study by the City of El Cajon (the "City") can be completed.

Ordinance No. 5054, by its terms, is only effective until December 30, 2016, or such reasonable time as the study may be completed, and any necessary public hearing process is conducted and amendments to the Title 17 of the El Cajon Municipal Code (the "Zoning Code") may be adopted, unless extended by ordinance of the City Council following a public hearing, whichever shall first occur.

The City has not completed its study in time to allow for the City's Planning Commission and the City Council to conduct their necessary public hearings, and to adopt any ordinance to amend the Zoning Code, and (because the City Council's next regular meeting is not until January 10, 2017) the moratorium established by Ordinance No. 5054 will expire unless extended for a period of time up to an additional ten (10) months and fifteen (15) days.

The purpose of the ordinance presented at this meeting is to extend the effectiveness of Ordinance No. 5054 by continuing to maintain the existing prohibition against

marijuana-related activities and uses, in all zones within the City, and to prohibit the outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals for personal use, in all zones within the City, until such reasonable time as a detailed study may be made.

While Government Code section 65858 requires a properly noticed public hearing prior to extending Ordinance No. 5054, it does not require an introduction and second reading, and will be effective immediately upon adoption.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The adoption of the extension of the urgency ordinance has no fiscal impact to the City.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND INTERIM URGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 5054 OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON, ADOPTED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65858, TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF OUTDOOR CULTIVATION OF MARIJUANA FOR PRIVATE USE, IN ALL ZONES

WHEREAS, the City of El Cajon ("City") has adopted an ordinance regulating land within the City as codified in Title 17 of the El Cajon Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City has previously adopted Ordinance No. 5038, modifying sections 17.105.020, 17.140.210, 17.145.150, 17.150.170 and Chapter 17.155 of Title 17 of the Municipal Code (the "Zoning Code") prohibiting the establishment of marijuana dispensaries, cooperatives and collectives, the storage and manufacturing of marijuana products, and the cultivation of marijuana, in all zones within El Cajon; and

WHEREAS, on June 28, 2016, the California Secretary of State certified an initiative measure for the November 8, 2016, statewide general election titled the "Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act," which initiative has received the designation as Proposition 64 ("Proposition 64"); and

WHEREAS, the preliminary results of the statewide election conducted on November 8, 2016, support the likelihood that Proposition 64 was approved by the voters of the State of California (the "State"), thereby legalizing marijuana for persons 21 years of age and older, and allowing the State to regulate the cultivation, testing, and sale of non-medical marijuana, including marijuana products, as well as establish statewide taxes for the commercial growth and retail sale of marijuana; and

WHEREAS, the City is undertaking a study to assist with the City's determination whether to continue to prohibit marijuana-related businesses, such as retail marijuana stores, shops, dispensaries, cooperatives or collectives, and to prohibit the commercial cultivation of marijuana, in all zones, even if such activities are in conformance with Proposition 64; and

WHEREAS, the City is also undertaking a study to assist with the City's determination whether persons should be allowed to plant, cultivate, harvest, dry or process marijuana outdoors upon the grounds of a private residence; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 5054 was adopted by the El Cajon City Council on November 15, 2016, as an interim urgency ordinance in order to temporarily prevent and prohibit the outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals for personal use, in all zones within the City, until such reasonable time as such detailed study by the City can be completed; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 5054, by its terms, is only effective until December 30, 2016, or such reasonable time as the study may be completed and any necessary public hearing process is conducted and amendments to the Zoning Code may be adopted, unless extended by ordinance of the City Council following a public hearing, whichever shall first occur; and

WHEREAS, the City has not completed its study in time to allow for the City's Planning Commission and City Council to conduct their necessary public hearings, and to adopt any ordinance to amend the Zoning Code, and the moratorium established by Ordinance No. 5054 would expire unless extended for a period of time up to an additional ten (10) months and fifteen (15) days; and

WHEREAS, the notice and public hearing required by section 65858(a) of the California Government Code for the extension of Ordinance No. 5054 has been provided in accordance with applicable law.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The City of El Cajon has an overriding interest in planning and regulating development of all uses of property within the City. Implicit in any plan or regulation is the City's interest in maintaining and improving the quality of life and the protection of the City's neighborhoods. Without stable, well-planned neighborhoods, areas of the City can quickly deteriorate, with detrimental consequences to social, environmental, and economic values. It is the intent of the City Council to assure that all neighborhoods remain well-planned and that residents maintain a high quality of life. This intent may be effectuated by a comprehensive study resulting in amendments to the Zoning Code.

SECTION 2: The purpose of this ordinance is to extend the effectiveness of Ordinance No. 5054 by continuing to maintain the existing prohibition against marijuana-related activities and uses, in all zones within the City, and to prohibit the outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals for personal use in all zones within the City, until such reasonable time as a detailed study may be made. Ordinance No. 5054 was adopted on November 15, 2016, as an urgency measure pursuant to Government Code section 65858, for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and welfare. The circumstances requiring the urgency measure continue to exist. The facts constituting the urgency are these: Allowing outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals, for personal use, without regulation or prohibition, is likely to create a burden on public safety resources, including both law enforcement and emergency response services, thereby reducing the quality of life within the City's neighborhoods. Such burdens include, but are not limited to, theft of marijuana plants, or parts thereof, if left unsecured; illegal consumption of marijuana and marijuana products by persons under 21 years of age, if left unsecured; and illegal sales of marijuana and marijuana products, if left unsecured. In view of the facts set forth in the aforementioned Recitals of this Ordinance, it is necessary to immediately study, hold hearings, and consider whether to amend the City's Zoning Code and adopt regulations for the outdoor cultivation of marijuana by individuals, for personal use, as may be recommended to the City Council by the City's Planning staff and the El Cajon Planning Commission. A comprehensive set of regulations cannot be enacted without due deliberation, and it will take an undetermined length of time to work out the details of the comprehensive regulations. It would be destructive of the proposed regulations if, during the period they are being studied and are the subject of public hearings, parties seeking to evade the operation of these regulations in the form they may be adopted should be permitted to operate in a manner which might progress so far as to defeat in whole or in part the ultimate objective of those regulations.

SECTION 3: Ordinance No. 5054 is hereby extended from December 30, 2016 to November 14, 2017, a period not to exceed ten (10) months and fifteen (15) days, unless prior to that date the above-mentioned amendment to the Zoning Code becomes operative, thereby rendering Ordinance No. 5054 and this ordinance repealed, void, and of no further force and effect by operation of law.

SECTION 4: The City Council of the City of El Cajon hereby declares that should any section, paragraph, sentence, phrase, term or word of this ordinance, hereby adopted, be declared for any reason to be invalid, it is the intent of the City Council that it would have adopted all other portions of this ordinance irrespective of any such portion declared invalid.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage by a 4/5ths vote of the City Council, and in accordance with Government Code section 65858, will be of no further force or effect on the date that the above-mentioned Zoning Code amendment becomes operative, or after November 14, 2017, whichever is sooner, except as may be extended as provided by said sections.

- 2. Authorizes the City Manager to negotiate a design-build contract with the Contractor to construct the Animal Shelter.

**BACKGROUND:** On December 8, 2015, the City Council approved the selection of the Contractor as the Construction Consultant for the Animal Shelter and authorized the City Manager to negotiate a contract for pre-construction services as allowed using the City's Alternative Procurement Process for design and construction of Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects.

Unlike the traditional design, bid, build procurement process used in California for decades to build capital projects, the Alternative Procurement Process provides for the City, the Design Architect, and a pre-qualified Contractor to collaboratively design and build the project. The City's Construction Consultant collaborated with City staff and the City's architectural design team, Ferguson Pape Baldwin Architects, for the development of a preliminary design including recommendations for the purpose of optimizing design and reducing construction costs. That process resulted in the completion of design development plans and specifications sufficient for the Contractor to deliver a GMP proposal that satisfies the City's goals and animal care needs. The Alternative Procurement Process has many advantages, including selection of a contractor based on qualifications rather than on price alone, consolidating the design and construction under one entity, control over maximum price and the reduction of risk to the owner. Overall, the Alternative Procurement Process is a superior method to deliver complex capital projects and has been used as the process of choice by hospitals and educational institutions for the last 15 years.

The design team has performed admirably in designing a building that is both durable and attractive and will meet the needs of the City for years to come. The new building will include many sustainable and operational features that include finishes and materials that are common in many of today's state-of-the-art animal shelters. In addition to the basics of being well-built, efficient, and easy to maintain, the goal was to create an inviting animal resource center that will be a benchmark for the care of animals and provide a facility of which the people of El Cajon can be proud.

To elaborate more on the process, extensive programming efforts were conducted between the Design Architect, the Construction Consultant, and City staff to determine the animal sheltering needs of the City, with the following goals in mind:

Goal 1 - Increase adoption rates, reduce euthanasia of animals, and make the adoption experience as convenient and welcoming as possible by providing a comfortable, low stress, easily accessible facility. Some of the features will include:

- High quality interior and exterior design building finishes to entice visitors to come in and enjoy the facility and surroundings.
- A retail approach to the design that displays the animals in tasteful and friendly ways.
- Light and airy/open facility that allows guests to see most animals and better navigate the public zones of the facility.
- Appropriate mechanical systems designed to provide comfortable temperatures, remove undesirable odors, and reduce disease transfer between animals.
- Easy access, circulation, and way-finding signage within the facility will help to reduce confusion and frustration for potential owners and visitors.
- Separate, well-defined public entrances for adoptions, and lost and found and animal relinquishment. Each includes a generous lobby, seating areas and reception desks. It should be noted that the reception desks for the two purposes are directly adjacent to each other, but are separated by a wall to allow staff to work together or independently.
- Finishes and mechanical systems will help to reduce odors, improve the drying of surfaces, facilitate improved cleaning, and reduce disease transfer.

Goal 2 - Provide a multi-use meeting room that offers education and training programs for employees, volunteers and pet owners. These programs will contribute to the healthcare and well-being of animals and ultimately reduce the number of unwanted animals.

Goal 3 - Reduce and minimize operational and maintenance costs. The design utilizes:

- Durable building materials and finishes, reliable building systems, energy and water- efficient equipment, and drought-tolerant landscaping.
- Resinous flooring with monolithic integral coved base at the floor/wall intersection that are easy to clean and eliminate square corners where grime and bacteria can accumulate.
- Acoustic ceiling tiles and wall panels (cleanable and moisture resistant in animal areas) for sound absorption, and acoustic wall assemblies from floor to bottom of roof deck around dog areas to contain noise.

Goal 4 - Incorporate sustainable design principles and innovation by integrating the latest trends, advancements, and best practices in animal care and sheltering that includes water-efficient fixtures, energy-efficient lighting and climate control. While not pursuing LEED Certification, the new El Cajon Animal Care Facility has taken an integrated approach to maximize synergies while creating a balanced solution with respect to cost and durability. This includes:

- Water efficient, native, drought-resistant plants using colorful species geared toward a beautiful and sustainable landscape adaptable to the El Cajon climate.
- Energy-efficiency building orientation. Indirect daylight to the north is maximized with indirect and controlled daylight to the south with minimal exposure to the east and west facades that pose a challenge to overheating.
- Building envelope performance is enhanced by using walls and roofs that are optimally insulated to minimize thermal loss.
- High Performance glazing reduces solar heat gain and allows daylight to penetrate deep into the building, offsetting the need for artificial lighting.
- Natural ventilation is optimized by locating the majority of kennels in naturallyventilated covered areas, capitalizing on the excellent weather conditions in El Cajon.
- Energy-efficient fixtures, astronomic clocks, and motion sensors that deliver high-performance.

The Design Architect proposes to utilize local building materials that are readily available such as structural steel, masonry block, metal panels, wood siding, and cast-in-place concrete that contain recycled materials and are regionally manufactured. This is planned in an effort to support local businesses, minimize energy required for transportation, and encourage regenerative design.

Earlier this year, the City Council was presented with the conceptual design scheme of the new animal shelter, and on November 1, 2016, the Planning Commission approved the Conditional Use Permit and the environmental documents for the project. This approval by the Planning Commission included project elevations and site design elements such as landscaping, architectural details and colors.

The next step in the process is for the City Council to consider the GMP submitted by the Contractor to complete the design and build the project in accordance with the preliminary plans and specifications as presented to the City Council and included in the GMP.

The GMP has been submitted by the Contractor, and has been reviewed by City staff. All costs were evaluated including mark-up percentages for overhead and profit. The GMP includes a base construction cost off \$7,130,510 and an additional \$2,203,297 for contractor overhead and profit, contingencies, completed architectural and structural design, furniture, fixtures and equipment. As an incentive to the Contractor, if any savings in costs are realized less than the GMP, both the Contractor and the City will share the savings using a formula that would grant a 35% share of the savings to the Contractor.

Staff is recommending that the City Council accept the GMP proposal and authorize the City Manager or his designee to negotiate a design-build contract with the Contractor.

**CEQA:** The Planning Commission approved a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation and Monitoring Reporting Program.

FISCAL IMPACT: The GMP submitted by the Contractor is for a maximum of \$9,333,807. The actual amount may be less, if cost contingencies and allowances are not expended. No general funds will be used for this project. Sufficient funding in Proposition "O" Funds was budgeted for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 to build the project in activity 502900-9060/PS0020.

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2015, a Request for Proposal ("RFP") was issued for Alternative Project Procurement Services and a Guaranteed Maximum Price ("GMP") proposal for pre-construction services for design and construction ("design-build") of the El Cajon Animal Shelter – PS 00200/PW3121-2 Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, C.W. Driver, Incorporated ("Driver") was selected from four (4) finalists as the respondent which can provide the best value; met the evaluation criteria specified in the RFP, including licensing, experience and technical competence, schedule, rates, insurance, and financial resources; can provide all the requirements for both the pre-construction and design-build construction contracts; and with whom the City of El Cajon (the "City") could negotiate an agreement; and

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2015, the City Council approved the award of a contract for pre-construction services to Driver in accordance the City's alternative procurement procedures for design and construction of Capital Improvement Projects; and

WHEREAS, on May 10, 2016, Driver entered into a contract with the City to perform pre-construction services, culminating with the delivery of a GMP proposal to complete the design and build the project; and

WHEREAS, Driver, as a construction consultant, collaborated with City staff and the City's architect, Ferguson Pape Baldwin Architects ("FPBA"), to evaluate the building design and provide recommendations to control construction costs resulting in delivery of a GMP proposal for building design and construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the GMP includes a base cost for the design and construction of the Project of \$7,130,510, and \$2,203,297 for contingencies, overhead, profit, furniture fixtures and equipment, for a total GMP of \$9,333,807; and

WHEREAS, the City and Driver are working out language to include in the designbuild contract consistent with the GMP proposal; and WHEREAS, staff recommends that the City Council accepts the GMP proposal and authorizes the City Manager to negotiate a design-build contract with Driver; and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2016, the City Planning Commission certified a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation and Monitoring Reporting Program to mitigate the projects impacts below the level of significance; and






