EDCO's Collection Services

Starting in December, EDCO will begin exchanging carts, dumpsters, and/or roll-off boxes used to collect solid waste, recyclable materials and organic waste.

"We'll Take Care of It!"

EDCO will consistently provide superior customer service to the residents of El Cajon by demonstrating our "We'll Take Care of It" attitude through all of our services! This attitude and motto is the foundation of EDCO's approach to customers, communities, fellow employees and the environment.

Will My Rate Increase?

Yes. Multi-family customers will be paying a bundled service rate for all collection services (trash, recycling and organics). EDCO's multifamily collection service includes additional enhanced services such as an annual Christmas tree collection, on-call bulky item collection service, and bi-annual cleanup events. Customers can offset this rate by using your recycling capacity to lower your trash rate.

Effective January 1, 2021,

EDCO will provide waste and recycling services to residents in the City of El Cajon.

When Will EDCO Begin Collection Services?

Effective Saturday, January 2, 2021 (one-day delay for complexes serviced on Friday due to the New Year holiday), EDCO will start collecting trash, recycling and organic waste. Your current provider will continue to collect residential trash, recycling, and green waste through Thursday, December 31, 2020.

Will There Be A Change In My Bill?

Yes. Invoices will have a new look and remittance address. A detailed overview will be provided in the initial billing.

EDCO's Bundled Collection Service

With EDCO, multi-family customers will subscribe to a bundled collection service which will include trash, recycling, and organics collection <u>all under one collective rate</u>.

Trash

EDCO will provide wheeled carts, dumpsters and/or roll-off boxes for collection of solid waste. Customers will have the opportunity to subscribe to the appropriate service level, that will include carts (32-, 64- and 96-gallons), dumpsters (1 - 6 cubic yards), 3-cubic-yard split dumpsters, as well as roll-off boxes (10 - 40 cubic yards) and will be serviced at least once per week and up to seven (7) times per week.



- Recyclables
- Organics, including yard and food waste
- TRASH CONTAINER: Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)
 - Electronics or batteries

- Flourescent light bulbs
- Pharmaceuticals, medical waste or needles
- Automobile parts, including motor oil, oil filters, batteries, and tires



Recycling

EDCO will provide each multi-family unit with the equivalent volume of one 32-gallon recycling cart for weekly collection of commingled recycling. Additional multi-family recycling collection service can be provided for an additional cost in variable size recycling carts and/or dumpsters, with the volume, collection frequency, and container type based on the individual needs of the complex.

EDCO offers residents several recycling programs to collect a variety of recyclable materials. To ensure program success, your EDCO representative can provide bilingual educational materials to support your program.

To get your recycling program going, we will:

- Evaluate the benefits and costs of a recycling program in your complex.
- Develop a recycling collection program to include: outside BLUE recycling containers and on-site recycling presentations.
- Once the program is in place, start recycling!

Recyclable materials include, but are not limited to:



PAPERBOARD:

Paperboard boxes such as cereal boxes, tissue boxes, refrigerated food boxes, boxes from toiletries, and soda/beer



STYROFOAM:

Clean foam cups, meat trays, plates, egg cartons, block packaging (no peanuts), rigid polystyrene, and carry-out containers.



CARTON CONTAINERS:

Aseptic cartons, including milk cartons and juice boxes, half-gallon juice cartons, soup/broth cartons, and wine cartons.



ALUMINUM:

Aluminum, steel and tin cans, such as food and beverage cans for soda, soup, beer, beans, fruit, and vegetables. Clean aluminum foil, clean aluminum trays, and pie tins.



METAL:

Dry and empty paint and aerosol cans.



SHREDDED PAPER:

Shredded paper (placed in a clear bag is okay for easy identifying).



CARDBOARD:

Cardboard, including boxes used for moving and shipping or any other box or packaging made of corrugated cardboard.



GLASS CONTAINERS:

Glass containers including food jars and beverage bottles.



MIXED PAPER:

Mixed paper, including junk mail, catalogs, magazines, newspapers, and paper used for computer printing.



#1-#7 PLASTICS: All plastic containers, lids, and packaging with a recycling symbol of #1-7 (all containers accepted with caps and lids): water and soda bottles, peanut butter and other food jars, mouthwash bottles, vegetable oil containers, automotive oil containers, ovenable food trays, milk jugs, juice bottles, shampoo and conditioner bottles, detergent and bleach containers, condiment bottles, medicine bottles, bottle caps, butter and yogurt tubs, CD cases, baby bottles, 5-gallon water bottles, CDs, medical storage containers, and rigid plastics such as 5-gallon butter.

All food and beverage containers should be EMPTY: no/minimal food residue and no liquids remaining, and boxes should be broken down and flattened to fit inside the recycling cart.

Organics

EDCO's New Organics Recycling Program will Collect Food Scraps and Yard Waste Mixed Together in Your Green Container

EDCO will provide each multi-family unit with the equivalent volume of one 32-gallon organics cart for weekly collection of organic waste.

Use the green organics cart to separate material such as landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste and organics, such as food waste, *all mixed together*. **Organics include**, **but are not limited to:**



Food Scraps

Cooked or raw meat, poultry and seafood (including bones), cheese, dairy products, fruits, vegetables, grains, pasta, egg shells, bread, coffee grounds, tea bags, tea leaves, baked goods, nuts, jelly, candy, snack foods, leftovers, spoiled food.

How to Collect

- Use a kitchen caddie, see page 6.
- Place food scraps directly in your cart (loose or in paper bags) and ensure the lid closes.

What to Avoid

Do not include liquids, fats, oils, grease, plastic, glass, metals, Styrofoam.



Food-Soiled Paper

Paper bags, paper napkins, paper towels, paper plates, paper cups, paper take-out containers and take-out boxes (with no plastic or wax coating, and with metal removed), coffee filters, tissues.

How to Collect

- Paper can be dry or wet.
- Place food-soiled paper directly in your cart (loose or in paper bags) and ensure the lid closes.

Keep these items out of your organics container! Prohibited items cannot break down or cause a safety hazard for collection crews.



- Aluminum
- Animal carcasses
- Cigarette butts and ashes
- Clothing
- Diapers
- Dirt
- Fats, oils, grease
- Glass
- Hazardous waste

- Kitty litter
- Landscape timbers
- Liquids

Landscape Waste

Grass clippings, small branches, small tree limbs, tree roots, flowers, leaves, plants, straw.

How to Collect

 Place yard trimmings directly in your cart (loose or in paper bags) and ensure the lid closes.

What to Avoid

No rocks, dirt, soil, or tree stumps.




Natural Fibers

Popsicle sticks, sawdust, toothpicks, wooden chopsticks, untreated wood.

How to Collect

• Place natural fibers directly in your cart (loose or in paper bags) and ensure the lid closes.

Please do not use plastic bags as they contaminate the Anaerobic Digester!

All organic material must be placed loosely inside the organics cart or dumpster for collection. Any material left outside the container cannot be collected.

Collecting Your Food Scraps

Collect food scraps in <u>any</u> container for an easy way to set aside leftovers for your green organics cart. Coffee cans, plastic food storage containers, or kitchen caddies can be used.



STFP 1

Keep your kitchen container in a convenient location in your kitchen, such as on the counter top, under the sink or in the freezer.



STFP 2

While cooking or cleaning up, place leftover food scraps and food-soiled paper into your kitchen container.



STEP 3

Empty the contents of your kitchen container into your green cart when it's full and before you set out the cart each week.

How do I get my food scraps from my kitchen to the organics cart?

There are many different ways to cleanly move food scraps from your kitchen to your organics cart. Here are some of the most popular options:

Wrap Your Scraps! - Many people find wrapping food waste in any type of non-wax paper, such as paper towels, packing paper, newspaper, or paper bags, is an easy way to move food waste from inside your kitchen to your organics cart. This is especially true for large quantities of fruit, meat, etc., and you can even leave the scraps wrapped in the paper and then just drop it into the organics cart.

Kitchen Caddies - A kitchen caddie is an optional, free 1.5 gallon sealable container that can be placed under your kitchen sink or another convenient area for your household to use. Kitchen caddies lock to keep odors in and once full, can be taken to your organics cart and emptied onto the green waste. After emptying, it can be washed out and is dishwasher safe. **To receive a free EDCO kitchen caddie, please visit our website, edcodisposal.com, and visit the Residential Service's Organics page to place an order**.

Containerize It - Many people have their own containers, such as coffee cans and Tupperware products that they are comfortable using to hold food scraps. Similar to kitchen caddies, once the container is full, it can be taken and emptied into the organics cart.

Freeze It - Several people choose to freeze their food scraps in containers and paper bags and then empty as needed.

OPTIONAL KITCHEN CADDIES ARE AVAILABLE VIA EDCODISPOSAL.COM

A kitchen caddie is a designated container specifically for the internal collection of organics in your home. <u>Any reusable container can be used</u> as a kitchen caddie, but EDCO also has an optional free kitchen caddie for your household use. Free Special Events and Services



Bulky Item Collection

If it's too heavy or too large to fit in your trash container, call us to schedule a FREE curbside bulky-item pickup (**must be scheduled through the property owner or manager**). Property owners or managers can schedule bulky-item pickup service for large items such as water heaters, appliances, furniture, televisions, etc. (please no Household Hazardous Waste). Construction material will NOT be collected. Four bulky item pickups per year can be scheduled per unit of up to six items each collection (equivalent to 0.5 cubic yards per collection).

Bulky-Item Drop-Off Cleanup Events

Twice a year, EDCO will hold FREE bulky item drop-off cleanup events. Detailed information will be sent out prior to the events.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Drop-Off Collection Event

Once a year, EDCO will hold a FREE HHW drop-off collection event. Detailed information will be sent out prior to the event.
