- El Cajon offers more motels than any other city; and
- Calls for Fire and Police Departments increased.

Patrick Grillot spoke about having a partnership approach with the County of San Diego, while maintaining a protective stance for the citizens of El Cajon.

Conversation continued among Council and Staff regarding:

- Using public funds for motel vouchers;
- Fair Housing laws;
- 28 day stay limit per voucher;
- Situational vs. chronic homelessness;
- Screening should be required prior to issuance of motel vouchers; and
- Drug use and mental problems in the homeless community.

Discussion to form a Council sub-committee to assist in drafting regulatory policy for motels operating with homeless vouchers.
