Constraints

- o Loss of "local control"
- o California laws decriminalizing crime
- o No bail policies
- o County jail policies
- o Lack of prosecution

Frequently Asked Questions

Why are there so many homeless in El Cajon and none in other areas like La Jolla?

- Historically a hub for social services in East County
- High percentage of affordable housing

Affordable Housing

- Some cities have more affordable housing than others.
- o Many factors why.
- On average, in SD County, 46.7% of housing is categorized as "low," "very low," or "extremely low."
